Dear Minister Chen:

Re: Key priorities for gender equality

Congratulations on your appointment as the new Minister of State for Child Care. West Coast LEAF has done in-depth research and law reform work on how child care services impact the human rights of women and children, and we applaud the government's creation of your role as a first step towards achieving a comprehensive and accessible child care system.

In 2016, we released a report entitled <u>High Stakes: the impacts of child care on the human rights of women and children</u>, which documents the ways in which the current child care crisis in BC undermines women's equality and human rights (available online at www.westcoastleaf.org). The report was based on interviews with a diverse group of women about their experiences with child care and documents the needs of particularly marginalized groups of women, including Indigenous women, women with disabilities, and women with precarious immigration status. The overarching finding of the project is that the current state of child care services in BC violates the human rights of women and children in complex and wideranging ways.

Ultimately, the report recommends that BC take immediate steps to adopt and implement the \$10aDay Plan. However, we also recognize that a comprehensive and coordinated public child care system cannot be built overnight. For that reason, we recommend that the BC government take immediate steps to ensure that the most serious human rights violations for women and children are remedied by creating a new funding category through Child Care Operating Funding to provide free child care to women fleeing violence, including those without legal immigration status; culturally appropriate caregivers awaiting reunification with children in government care; the children of women with disabilities that affect their ability to provide care; and low-income lone parent families, including those on social assistance if a parent is in school, training or searching for employment.
